We will always keep a small amount of tickets for the respective evening, which will be sold at the entrance for RM 35.


Children up to 15 years enter for free, from 16 years onwards they need a ticket for admission.

As this is a German festival, you cannot avoid meeting them. Watch out for those who will be wearing their traditional costumes. For women this means a “Dirndl”, which is a skirted dress with a corsage, a blouse and matching apron. The traditional men’s dress consists of a “Lederhosn” – leather trousers with braces and a white or checked shirt.

For your non-stop amusement a wide range of traditional German and popular world music is played by a live brass band. This year, we will be entertained by “Frankenräuber” from Bavaria. The song “Ein Prosit der Gemütlichkeit” is repeated as often as people are invited to raise their glasses and drink together.

A real German Oktoberfest for sure includes traditional German food, like sausages, sauerkraut, meatloaf and pretzels. Besides that a variety of international food, as well as cakes and also some local food, like satay and fried seafood will be offered.



### BEER

Traditionally the Oktoberfest is a typical beer festival. In Munich the breweries brew a special beer for this occasion, which is even a bit stronger than the normal one. Don’t expect much less at the MGS Oktoberfest: beside Carlsberg we offer two original German Oktoberfest draught beers, Löwenbräu and Erdinger. As bottled beers, Franziskaner, Erdinger, Warsteiner and König Ludwig will be on the counter. Wine, shandy, soft drinks, water and alcohol-free beer will also be offered.
